

## SUMMER 2010 INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITY IN WASHINGTON, DC FOR TRIBAL COLLEGE STUDENTS

The Quality Education for Minorities (QEM) Network is offering a 10-week internship in Washington, DC during Summer 2010 for students at Tribal Colleges and Universities who are successfully pursuing a science- or engineering-related degree. This internship opportunity is made possible through a grant to QEM from the National Science Foundation (NSF).

**The Internship Program will take place June 1 – August 6, 2010.**

### Participant Benefits Include:

- An opportunity to be an intern for 10 weeks in Washington, DC
- The opportunity to work with mentors at QEM Network as well as interact with science education professionals at NSF, the U.S. Department of Agriculture, the Office of Indian Education at the U.S. Department of Education, and other federal agencies
- Tours of museums, libraries, and other science- and health-focused sites in the Washington area, including the National Museum of the American Indian
- Roundtrip travel airfare and ground transportation allowances
- Housing for the entire ten-week duration of the Program
- A stipend for full-time participation
- A chance to develop a peer network that includes students from across the country who are serving as interns in other QEM summer programs.
